






- *To use time sync*, dock your iPhone/iPod and press the **Time Sync/Set Button**. The unit will sync to the time on your iPhone/iPod.
- To set time manually, move the **DST switch** on rear of unit to +1 or -1 (adds or subtracts an hour for daylight saving time or standard time).
- Press & hold the Time Sync/ Set button on the back of unit until the hour display flashes. Press ◀ / ➤ buttons to set the current hour.
- Press the Time Sync/ Set button. The minute display flashes.
 Press ◀ / ➤ buttons to set the current minutes.
- Press the Time Sync/ Set button again to confirm time setting.

Getting Started


Thank you for purchasing the iP40. Designed specifically to work with your iPhone and iPod, this system provides high quality audio performance that brings out the best in your music and lets you wake or sleep to it. Please read this instruction carefully before the appliance is operated and keep it for future reference.

Install iPhone/iPod Insert

Your iP40 comes with a set of inserts to ensure your iPhone or iPod fits properly in the dock on the top of the system.

To place an insert:

- 1. Select the insert for your iPhone/iPod.
- 2. Gently press the iPhone/iPod insert into the dock.
- 3. Carefully place your iPhone/iPod into the dock. The iPhone/iPod must not be in a case or "skin".
- 4. To remove/replace an insert, first remove your iPhone/iPod, grip the insert and pull gently upwards.



Installing/Replacing the Clock Backup Battery

The iP40 requires a CR2032 lithium battery (included) to provide backup power to the clock in the event of a temporary power interruption. The CR2032 backup battery was packed in the same poly bag with this instruction manual.


1. Place the clock radio face down on a flat surface.

2. Slide the battery door in the direction of the arrow and then lift the door by the opposite edge to remove it from the radio.

3. Install the CR2032 backup battery in the battery compartment with the "+" side facing up as shown in the illustration.

4. Replace the battery door.

If AC power is interrupted the backlighting in the display will go off and the radio or docked iPod/iPhone will not play. However, the buzzer alarm will still turn on at the selected time to wake you up, even if you had selected the Wake to Radio, or Wake to iPod alarm modes.



When the **Battery Low Icon** appears in the display it is time to replace the battery. Purchase a fresh CR2032 battery, available wherever batteries are sold. Follow steps 1 through 4 above to remove the exhausted battery and install the fresh battery. IMPORTANT: To avoid having to reset the time and wake up time, leave the radio connected to the AC outlet when you install the new backup battery.

Note: Make sure you dispose of the exhausted lithium battery properly, according to your local regulations.

Setting Up the iP40

1. Depending on your location and whether or not DST (Day Saving Time) is in effect, set the **DST Switch** located at the back of the unit to +1 to add an hour or to -1 to subtract an hour.

Time Sync from iPhone/iPod

The iP40 Time Sync feature allows you to sync the time on the iP40 to the time on your iPhone or recent model iPod (iPod Touch, iPod Nano and iPod Classic; older iPod models such as iPod mini do not support this feature).

- 1. Press the **Time Sync/Set Button** located at the back of the unit. A cursor will flash on the the display, indicating the unit is attempting to sync.
- 2. Once sync is completed two beeps will confirm sync was successful and the new time will be displayed.
- 3. If sync was not successful, one long beep will sound. If this happens, please try again with a different iPhone/iPod.

Note: iPhone time is automatically updated to the correct time via cell phone towers. The time on your iPod is accurate only to the time on the computer the last time the iPod was synced to it. It's possible to have up to 59 seconds difference between the iP40 and synced iPhone or iPod.

Setting Up the iP40

Setting Time

- 1. Press and hold the **Time Sync/Set Button** located at the back of the unit for 2 seconds until the time display flashes. Press the << or >> **button** to set the current hour (hold to advance rapidly).
- 2. Remember to set the correct AM or PM. The **PM Indicator** is located on the upper left hand side of the time display; there is no AM indicator.
- 3. Press the Time Sync/Set Button again to adjust minutes. Press the << or >> button to correct time.
- 4. If desired, press the 🖸 Button during time setting to toggle the clock format between 12 hour and 24 hour display mode.
- 5. Press the Time Sync/Set Button again (or no button within 10 seconds) to exit the time setting mode.

Using the Alarm

Setting the Alarm

- 1. Press and hold the 🕅 **Button** until the alarm icon and alarm time flashes. Press the << or >> **Button** to set the alarm hour. Remember to set the correct AM or PM time.
- 2. Press the 🖉 Button again to adjust minutes. Press the << or >> Button to set the alarm minutes.
- 3. Press the ♂ Button again to select wake to sound source. Press the << or >> Button to select wake to iPhone/iPod, radio or buzzer.

Note: if selected wake to source is iPhone/iPod but no iPhone/iPod is docked/detected, the iP40 will automatically switch to wake to buzzer.

4. Press the button again or if no key pressed for approx. 10 seconds to exit the setting mode. The alarm will be armed after set the alarm and corresponding alarm icon will light up.

Review, Arming and Disarming Alarm (Turn Alarm Function On and Off)

1. To arm/disarm the alarm, just press the 🖸 **Button** to toggle it on or off, indicated by the appearance or lack of the alarm icon on the display. The current alarm time also appears.

Resetting the Alarm to Come on the Next Day

1. When the alarm is sounding, press the **b** Button to stop the alarm and reset it to come on the following day.

Snooze Opeartion

- 1. Press and hold the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** for few seconds to set snooze time. Press the << or >> **Button** to set the snooze timer from 1 to 29 minutes.
- 2. Press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** after the alarm sounds, the alarm will be silenced and come on again after the set snooze time. Snooze can be pressed several times during the 1 hour alarm cycle.

Sure Alarm

The iP40 has a sure alarm feature. If the backup battery is installed, the buzzer alarm will still sound in the event of power failure.

Charging your iPhone/Pod

Note: Please make sure you are using the correct insert for your iPhone/iPod and that it is properly docked into the iP40. Failure to do so may damage your iPhone/iPod.

1. While your iPhone/iPod is docked in the unit and the unit is connected to AC power, it recharges (until fully charged). Note that other non-docking iPods will NOT charge.

Listening to iPhone/iPod

1. Dock the already playing iPhone/iPod, the iP40 will automatically turn on and you will hear the music playing from your iPhone/iPod.

Note: If the playing song/music loudness is too low on the iPhone/iPod itself, iP40 may not detect iPhone/iPod is in play mode. Press the **>II Button** to play it. iPhone/iPod icon will turn on to show iP40 is running under iPhone/iPod mode.

- 2. When the iPhone/iPod is docked and in standby mode, press the ►II Button to play it.
- 3. Press the ► Button again to pause play; press again to resume it.
- 4. To skip to different music tracks or to perform high speed music search within a track, you may press the << or >> buttons on the top panel of the iP40. These controls have the same function as the I<< or >>I buttons on your iPod click wheel or your iPhone display.
- 5. Press the or •) Button to adjust the system volume.
- 6. Press **EXB Button** located on the rear of the unit to enhance the bass sound.
- 7. To turn off the unit, press the **b Button**. iPhone/iPod will continue charging while in the dock.

Listening to FM Radio

Setting up Antenna

Extend wire antenna fully for best reception. Do not strip, alter or attach to other antennas.

Tuning and Playing the Radio

- 1. Press the Radio/Aux Button to turn the iP40 on. The radio icon in the lower part of the display will appear.
- 2. Press the << or >> Button to tune the radio to a desired station. Press and hold briefly to scan to next clear station.
- 3. Press the or •) Button to adjust the system volume.
- 4. Press the **EXB Button** located on the rear of the unit to enhance the bass sound.
- 5. To turn off the unit, press the **b Button**. iPhone/iPod will continue charging while in the dock.

Aux Jack

If you are using an iPod without a docking port or other MP3 player or other portable audio device, you can play it through the iP40 via the Aux Line-in Jack.

- 1. Plug one end of an audio patch cord (not included) into the headphone or line-out jack on your device and the other end of the patch cord into the iP40 Aux Line-in Jack, located on the back of the unit.
- 2. Press the Radio/Aux until the AUX icon appears on the lower part of the display, indicating AUX mode.
- 3. Turn on and play your device.
- 4. Press the or •)) Button to adjust the system volume. You may need to adjust the volume on your device, too.
- 5. Press the **EXB Button** located on the rear of the unit to enhance the bass sound.
- 6. To turn off the unit, press the **O Button**. Please remember to turn off your device, too.

Sleep Operation

Sleep mode lets you sleep to your iPhone/Pod or radio, gradually lowering the volume until the unit shuts off at the selected time. iP40's sleep volume setting is independent of the normal volume level. You may adjust the sleep-to music volume to a softer level without affecting the main volume level that you will hear when the alarm turns on.

- 1. Press the Sleep Button to enter sleep mode. The sleep icon will show in the lower part of the display.
- 2. You can adjust the sleep timer from 90, 60, 30 or 15 minutes by pressing the button again.
- 3. iP40 has independent volume setting for sleep mode so you can adjust the sleeping volume without affecting the alarm volume. Press the or •) Button to adjust the sleep volume. The sleep volume will remain at that level the next time you enter sleep mode until controls are changed.
- 4. When the display changes back to show the real time, pressing the **Sleep Button** once will show the sleep time remaining. Pressing it again will change sleep time to next lowest increment.
- 5. To stop listening at any time, press the **b Button** to turn unit off.

Using the iP40 in Other Countries

Setting Radio Frequency/Reception Range

Different regions of the world use different FM radio frequency steps and ranges. You will need to select the one that matches the standards in your region (USA, EUROPE, JAPAN, AUSTRALIA, or CHINA). The default setting is USA; if you live in the US, you may skip this section.

- 1. Make sure the iP40 is OFF (not playing in any mode). Press and hold the **Radio Button** for about 5 seconds until the radio icon flashes in the lower part of the display. Press the << or >> **Button** to select your region.
- 2. Press the Radio Button again (or no button within 10 seconds) to exit the radio frequency setting mode.

Dimmer Operation

During normal operation, press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** to set the brightness of the LCD display and accent lighting to to Hi, Mid, Low, Low display only or Off.
