


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Maintenance

- Place the unit on a level surface away from sources of direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Protect your furniture when placing your unit on a natural wood and lacquered finish. A cloth or other protective material should be placed between it and the furniture.
- Clean your unit with a soft cloth moistened only with mild soap and water. Stronger cleaning agents, such as Benzene, thinner or similar materials can damage the surface of the unit.


Controls and Indicators




Unit Display



Quick Start



Connect AC adaptor to jack on back of the unit and plug into a wall socket. Remove the tab from the battery backup compartment on the back of the unit. For portable use, install 4 AA batteries into battery compartment on back of unit.



Press and hold **Alarm 1** or **Alarm 2 Button** until display flashes. Press the **+** or **- Buttons** to adjust the alarm time (hold for rapid setting). Press the **Mode Button** to select buzzer or radio as alarm source. Press the **Alarm Button** to confirm alarm setting.

2: clock set



- Move the DST switch on back of unit to +1 or -1 (adds or subtracts an hour)
- Press & hold the Clock Set Button on back until the display flashes
- Press the + or Buttons to adjust the time (hold for rapid setting)
- Press the Clock Set Button again.

4: radio



Press the **Power Button** to turn unit ON. Press the **Mode Button** as needed to select AM/FM band. Extend antenna on back of unit. Turn the **Tuning Knob** to tune in a station. Adjust antenna for best reception.

Using the RT212


Connect Unit to AC Power Source

Plug the included AC adaptor into the AC adaptor jack on the back of the unit and the other end into a standard 120V AC wall socket.

Installing/Replacing Batteries for Portable Operation

This unit requires 4 "AA" (R6) batteries, not included, for portable operation. We recommend using a well-known brand of alkaline batteries for longest life and best performance.

- a) Open the battery compartment door, located on the back panel
- Insert 4 "AA" (R6) batteries in the compartment according to the polarity (+/ -) markings engraved in the compartment. Note: If the batteries are inserted incorrectly the unit will not work.
- Replace the battery compartment door.
 Replace the batteries when the sound of the unit becomes weak or distorted.



Battery Information

- Always replace all 4 batteries at the same time. Do not mix old and new.
- Do not mix various types of batteries such as carbon-zinc, alkaline, lithium, etc.
- Do not attempt to re-charge normal batteries.
- Do not leave exhausted batteries in the unit for an extended period of time. They may eventually leak, causing possible damage to your unit and surrounding surfaces.
- Dispose of exhausted batteries properly, in accordance with your local recycling regulations.

Setting the Clock

- a) If Daylight Saving Time is in effect, slide the **DST switch** on the back panel to the +1 position. If Standard Time is in effect slide the **DST switch** to the -1 position.
- b) Press and hold the Clock Set Button on the rear of the unit until the clock display flashes.
- c) Press the + or Button as needed to adjust the display to the current time (hold for rapid setting). AM and PM indicators appear at the bottom of the display. Make sure you set the clock to the correct AM or PM time.
- d) Press the Clock Set Button again to confirm the time setting. Two beeps will indicate clock setting is complete

Using the Alarms

The unit has two independent alarms. Each can be set to wake you at separate times to the current radio station or to a buzzer alarm. **Note:** Alarm 1 and Alarm 2 are set the same way; **Alarm Button** below means the button (Alarm 1 or Alarm 2) for whichever alarm you are setting.

Setting the Alarms

- a) Press and hold the Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 Button until the alarm time flashes.
- b) Press the + or Button as needed to adjust the display to the desired alarm time (hold for rapid setting). AM and PM indicators appear at the bottom of the display. Make sure you set the display to the correct AM or PM alarm time.
- c) During alarm setting, press the **Mode Button** to select Buzzer or Radio (last selected station) to wake to. Default mode is buzzer.
- d) Press the Alarm Button again to confirm alarm setting. To set another alarm, follow steps a d.

Using the RT212

Arming and Disarming Alarm (Turn Alarm Function ON and OFF)

Press Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 Button to arm or disarm alarm function. When armed, the related alarm icon appears in the display.

Resetting the Alarm to Come on the Next Day

When the alarm is sounding, press the related **Alarm Button** or the **Power Button** to stop the alarm and reset it to come on the following day.

Snooze

Press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** after the alarm sounds. The alarm will be silenced and come on again after nine minutes. Snooze can be pressed several times during the 1 hour alarm cycle.

Sure Alarm

The unit has a sure alarm feature so the buzzer alarm will still sound in the event of power failure, if backup battery is installed.

Radio

Antenna Information

AM – The AM bar antenna is inside the cabinet. If AM reception is unsatisfactory try turning the cabinet until you find the position that provides the best reception.

FM – Extend the telescoping FM rod antenna on the back cabinet to its full length. You may have to vary the direction of the antenna until you find the position that provides the best reception.

Tuning and Playing the Radio

- a) Press the Mode Button as needed to select FM or AM radio band, indicated by the FM or AM icon on the display.
- b) Turn the **Tuning Knob** on the right side of the unit to tune radio to a desired station. The time display changes to radio frequency during tuning. After five seconds the display returns to the current time.
- c) Turn the Volume Knob to adjust unit volume up or down.
- d) Press the Power Button to turn the unit off.

Using the Line-in Jack

- a) Use a standard stereo audio cable with 3.5 mm plugs (available at www.ihomeaudio.com) to play your audio device through the Line-in Jack (connect one end in the device's line out or headphones jack, the other in the line-in jack located on the rear of the unit).
- b) Press the Power Button to turn on the unit.
- c) To listen to your audio device, press the Mode Button until LINE-IN is displayed, indicating line-in mode.
- d) Place your audio device in play mode.
- e) Turn the **Volume Knob** to adjust the volume on the unit. You may need to adjust the output volume on your line-in device, too.
- f) When you are done listening, press the **Power Button** to turn off the unit. Remember to turn off your audio device, too.

Using the RT212

Using Sleep Mode

Sleep mode lets you sleep to the current radio station, gradually lowering the volume until the unit shuts off at the selected time.

Press the **Sleep Button** as needed to select an amount of time before the unit shuts off: 120, 90, 60, 30 or 15 minutes, or Off to exit sleep mode and shut the unit off.

Using the Dimmer

Press the **Snooze/Dimmer Button** during normal operation to adjust brightness of LCD display. There are several levels of brightness including OFF.


Replacing Back-up Battery

The unit comes with 1 CR2450 back-up battery installed to provide continuous alarm operation and clock settings in the event of a power failure. **Remove the battery pull tab before use**. When the Battery Low Icon located on the right side of the display is flashing, it is time to replace the back-up battery. The battery compartment is located on the bottom of the unit.

- Please make sure the unit is connected to AC power source, otherwise all settings may be lost during battery replacement.
 Use a Phillips screwdriver to remove the battery compartment cover located on the
- back of the unit. Remove exhausted CR2450 battery.
- 3. Insert a fresh CR2450 battery, checking that the + side is facing you. Replace the compartment door.

Note: Make sure you dispose of battery properly (see your local regulations).

WARNING: Lithium batteries can explode or cause burns if disassembled, shorted, recharged, exposed to water, fire, or high temperatures. A Consumer Guide to Product Safety

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When used in the directed manner, this unit has been designed and manufactured to ensure your personal safety. However, improper use can result in potential electrical shock or fire hazards. Please read all safety and operating instructions carefully before installation and use, and keep these instructions handy for future reference. Take special note of all warnings listed in these instructions and on the unit.

- Water and Moisture The unit should not be used near water. For example: near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool or in a wet basement.
- 2. Ventilation The unit should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, it should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block ventilation openings. Also, it should not be placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet, which may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings.
- Heat The unit should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

Troubleshooting

Symptom	Possible Problem	Solution
Unit does not turn on	Power cord isn't plugged into a working wall socket	Connect the power cord into a working wall socket, make sure any switch that controls the outlet is ON. Try testing a trusted device in the outlet.
Battery Low icon always flashing	Backup battery is weak/ needs replacement	Replace with new battery
	Battery not installed properly	Check to make sure the polarity (+) matches the diagram in the battery compartment
Unit performance is erratic	The unit is reacting to external interference	Move unit away from potential sources of external interference such as computers, modems, wireless devices (routers) or fluorescent light.
No sound from unit	Volume is set too low on unit	Make sure volume is turned up
AM band radio is very noisy	Unit isn't located properly	Move/ rotate the unit for best reception
Sound is distorted	Volume level is set too high	Decrease the volume
	Sound source is distorted	If you are using an external sound source like older generation of iPod or iPod Shuffle, try reducing the output volume on the device itself.
Alarm not working	AM/PM time/alarm time not set correctly	When setting clock or alarm time, take note of the AM and PM indicators
	Alarm time or source selected for alarm 2, not alarm 1 or vice versa	Make sure to set the alarm time and source for the alarm icon 1 or 2 that is shown on the clock display
